Requirements for a P.Eng licence in Ontario [Section 14 of the Act]

1. Be 18 years of age
2. Be of good character
3. Successfully complete the PPE (Professional Practice Examination)

Why is a licence required?

From the PEO website:

Only those individuals that hold a P.Eng. licence can use the words “professional engineer” or “engineer” in their job title and the letters “P.Eng.” after their name.

and the **Professional Engineers Act**, R.S.O. 1990 Chapter P.28, Section 12(1):

*No person shall engage in the **practice of professional engineering** or hold himself, herself or itself out as engaging in the practice of professional engineering unless the person is the holder of a licence, a temporary licence, a provisional licence or a limited licence.*

What is the “practice of professional engineering” they refer to in the Act?

- a) *means any act of planning, designing, composing, evaluating, advising, reporting, directing or supervising that requires*
- b) *the application of engineering principles and*
- c) *concerns the safeguarding of life, health, property, economic interests, the public welfare or the environment, or the managing of any such act;*

If you answer “yes” to all 3 conditions, then you require a license from the PEO.
